

Religion The belief in and worship of a superhuman power or powers, especially a God or gods (Google)

The Church

The worldwide community of people who love and follow Jesus, who believe in His divinity and resurrection, and who are commanded to share the good news of His salvation to the world

N.B. Not all churches are Christian (e.g. Church of Scientology, Latter Day Saints, Christ Scientist)

Denomination

A religious group that has slightly different beliefs from other groups that share the same religion (Cambridge Dictionary)

The 3 main Christians denominations



Doctrine A set of beliefs (Latin <u>doctor</u> = 'teacher')




Heresy

Sect A religious group that has separated from a larger religion and is considered to have extreme or unusual beliefs or customs (Cambridge Dictionary)

What is a sect?



(<u>hairesis</u> - 'self-chosen opinion') Self-chosen doctrines that do not originate from God Departure from the fundamental teaching of Scripture
